## MUSEUMS

### **Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum**

Come relive that historic night in the Boston Harbor on December 16th, 1773, when American Colonists took matters into their own hands to oppose British rule. The new Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum is located in the middle of the Fort Point Channel and includes interactive exhibits that will transport visitors back in time to Revolutionary Boston! <http://www.bostonteatartyship.com/>

### **John F. Kennedy Library & Museum**

Located on a ten-acre park, overlooking the sea that he loved and the city that launched him to greatness, the Library stands as a vibrant tribute to the life and times of John F. Kennedy. ### **U.S.S. Constitution Museum**

Visitors to the USS Constitution Museum's galleries experience the Constitution's history and the lives of the men who sailed her.
